




A magical story with favourites Flora & Fern as they discover the true meaning of wonder and friendship.

Educational Applicability

Flora & Fern Wonder in the Woods takes the reader on an exciting adventure in the idyllic English countryside, following two bunnies as they prepare to give a festive party. Holly Wood is home to all sorts of wonderful animals and Flora & Fern spend hours gathering natural elements to give the best party ever. Although very different in character, both are curious and determined and we see how Flora and Fern guide each other throughout the day. Sometimes things don't go to plan and it's often the quieter sibling who steers the usually more confident one back on course. Celebrating kindness and friendship, this story is told through engaging text and illustrated with lively and happy colours. The Duchess's ginger biscuit recipe is a treat for all at the end.

Discussion Topics

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- 1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
- 2. What are Flora & Fern planning to do?
- 3. Describe Flora & Fern's burrow? What's inside?
- 4. What are Flora & Fern gathering? What's on their list? Why do you think they are going to need these items? If you were giving a party, what would be on your list?
- 5. Who do they meet on their adventure? Name all the animals.
- 6. What happens when Flora picks a blackberry?
- 7. What does 'hibernating' mean? Can you name animals that hibernate?
- 8. How does Fern comfort Flora?
- 9. What do the siblings discover when they arrive back home?
- 10. Who is banging on the door and what have they brought with them?
- 11. Describe the scene at the end.
- 12. Flora & Fern have used natural objects for their party and to decorate their burrow. What have they used the natural objects for? This could be a good starting point to talk about sustainability and the environment.
- 13. What do you think about the end of the story? What sort of message is being given? How do you think Herbie feels? Talk about inclusion and community here.
- 14. Write down some adjectives that you'd use to describe Flora and some to describe Fern. How are they different?
- 15. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?
- 16. Look at the endpapers. What are the names of the animals' homes? Do you know the names of any other animal homes?








The Duchess's Festive Ginger Biscuits

Ingredients (makes 25-30 biscuits)

- 225g plain flour
- Pinch of salt
- 2 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 2 tsp ground ginger

- 100g unsalted butter
- · 100g soft brown sugar
- · 100g golden syrup
- 3 or 4 tbsp warmed milk
- · Icing to decorate (optional)



Method

- 1. Sift the flour into a bowl and add the salt, bicarbonate of soda and the spices.
- 2. In a saucepan, melt the butter, then stir in the sugar and golden syrup. Take the pan off the heat and let it cool a little.
- 3. Make a well in the flour mixture and add the melted ingredients and warmed milk. Mix it well, first with a wooden spoon, then with your fingers to create a dough. Chill for one hour.
- 4. Preheat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas mark 6.
- 5. Sprinkle some flour onto a wooden board and roll out the dough so it's 3-5mm thick. With festive cutters, make as many shapes as you can. When you think you're nearly done, re-roll the spare dough - there may be more to come.
- 6. Carefully place your shapes on a lined or greased baking tray, and bake for 10 minutes or until they are light golden brown.
- 7. When they're still warm from the oven, make a small hole in the biscuits with a skewer. Let them cool.
- 8. Decorate with icing, then thread them with ribbon or string and hang them on your tree!









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
